It is a venue for Martin to speak about her work, her working methods, her life as an artist, and her views about the creative process. She also discusses her film, "Gabriel" and reads from her poetry and lectures. In keeping with Martin's chosen life of solitude, she alone appears in the documentary.



BETWEEN

Shades of Winter's BETWEEN, a Red Bull Media House co-production, is the latest film by Austrian pro skier and filmmaker Sandra Lahnsteiner who keeps redefining women in action sports movies since the first release in 2010. Between earth and sky, ocean and snow, old friends and new, between the day-to-day challenges and the once-in-a-lifetime thrills of travelling to some of the most exotic and challenging slopes in the world and then mastering them, not missing the moments between. The new UHD 4K action sports feature film with a documentary aspect, not only follows the crème de la crème of female skiing including Olympic gold medallist and alpine skier Julia Mancuso and many more on compelling journeys and to thrilling destinations; it also features three-time world surf champion Carissa Moore. For Between, the long-term duo Sandra Lahnsteiner and director of photography Mathias Bergmann teamed up with German film editor Thomas Kohler known for the documentary "Cerro Torre" (2013).

BRAINWASHING OF MY DAD

A look at the rise of right-wing media through the lens of director Jen Senko's WWII vet father who changed from a life-long, nonpolitical Democrat to an angry, right-wing fanatic after his discovery of talk radio on a lengthened commute to work. In trying to understand how this happened, she not only finds this to be a phenomenon, but also uncovers some of the forces behind it including a plan by Roger Ailes under Nixon to create a media for the GOP; the Lewis Powell Memo, urging business leaders to influence institutions of public opinion - especially the universities - the media and the courts; and under Reagan, the dismantling of the Fairness Doctrine.




INTERLUDE CITY OF A DEAD WOMAN

STARRING BERNARD HILL, ANGELA ISMAILOS

The austere beauty of the Greek island provides a dramatic backdrop that naturally molds an aesthetic code of simplicity and mysticism. Three of the five main characters, a former opera singer, a priest and a bullfighter, have fled to Patmos seeking redemption. The other two, an older British couple, are fugitives of modern life who came here long ago seeking salvation and alternative living. Their interaction will irrevocably affect each other's lives. "Interlude City of a Dead Woman" is about a circle of life that lies beyond ordinary comprehension. Through a process of individual crisis and recol-lection the main characters will reach meaningful answers, which will enable them to continue their journeys.

A reluctant faith healer tries to escape his darkened past until his predatory evangelist mother tracks him down, stopping at nothing to get her son and his miraculous gifts back on the revival circuit. A DANGEROUS IDEA

A Dangerous Idea reveals a tragic history of how scientists and policymakers conspired to roll back gains toward race, class and gender equality, based on the mistaken belief that genes make us who we are. Unscientific arguments were used to restrict immigration of certain groups of people, slash funding for Head Start programs, and justify a 75 year eugenics program that robbed hundreds of thousands of Americans of their right to bear children. The film warns that with rising inequality in America today, there is a dangerous return to pseudo-scientific explanations.

SUNDAY, 12/11, 5PM | THE SCREEN STARRING LAUREN MYERS OF MANHATTAN



DOG DAYS OF WINTER

Told from the point of view of some of the most influential pioneers of the sport, 'Dog Days' tells the story of key people and events that set the stage for the birth of the sport, the spirit that freestyle is rooted in, factors that took the 'free' out of freestyle and reflections on what has become of the sport today.



DEAD RIVER

DEAD RIVER is an intellectual mystery/drama set in the literary world. A professor, Grant Bingham (played by Morse Bicknell), begins a biography of his idol, Luther Nash (Eb Lottimer), a famous crime writer. When Grant's wife Lisa (Lora Cunningham) meets the author, they form a bond, and Grant soon finds himself losing control of his family and his book. Grant delves deeper into Luther's past and discovers that behind the fiction may be an even darker reality.





DRIVING WITH SELVI

Selvi is forced to marry at a young age, only to find herself in a violent and abusive marriage. One day in deep despair, she chooses to escape, going to a highway with the intention of throwing herself under the wheels of a bus. Instead she gets on the bus, choosing to live... and goes on to become South India's first female taxi driver. Over a ten-year journey, we see a remarkable transformation as Selvi finds her voice and defies all expectations - learning to drive, starting her own taxi company, leading seminars to educate other women.



EL INCENDIO (THE FIRE) - ARGENTINA

Lucía and Marcelo are thirty years old. They are carrying a hundred thousand dollars in cash to pay for their new house. But something comes up for the real estate agent and the signing of the papers is postponed. Tense and filled with frustration, they head back to their old apartment and put the money away in a safe place. Marcelo says to her: "Relax, today's just another day". Throughout the 24 hours of wait, the true nature of the love between Lucía and Marcelo unveils, as well as the crisis they are in and the violence within themselves. The film narrates these 24 hours of unbearable tension.



EVERYBODY KNOWS...ELIZABETH MURRAY

This film explores the relationship between groundbreaking artist Elizabeth Murray and her family life and career and reconsiders her place in the contemporary art history. Murray's personal journals, voiced by Meryl Streep, give viewers a privileged window into Murray's internal struggles and incredible ambition with footage of Murray in her studio and home videos which help round out this profile of her life and exclusive interviews with art world luminaries. These include Chuck Close, Vija Celmins, Adam Weinberg, Robert Storr, Roberta Smith among many others, provide the historical backdrop for the New York art scene.

Set in Caracas during the 24 hours of a controversial medical strike, the film tells the story of Parca (The Reaper) a feared hit man that is forced to take an elite hospital hostage in an attempt to save his wounded girlfriend. The police don't take long to arrive, and with them, a circus of media and onlookers. Parca soon becomes an unlikely hero, a "champion for the poor," until his stunt begins to divide the entire nation and violence begins to spread within the hospital and throughout the city, putting everything, including his girlfriend and her child, in dire jeopardy. A love story told in the midst of chaos, The Zero Hour is a timely and universal story about the mythic rise to power and the inevitable fall from grace.

The Borderlands Research Institute, Texas Parks and Wildlife, and private landowners have teamed up to revive dwindling populations in West Texas. In January of 2016, they set out to capture over 100 pronghorn from an abundant herd in the Texas Panhandle and translocate them 500 miles to revive a dwindling herd near Marfa, TX.
